

My dear people,

Throughout the Church, today is VOCATION SUNDAY. It was established by Pope Paul VI after the Second Vatican Council as an occasion to reflect on God's plan for the Church and the World. God has allowed Himself to need us. Not that He cannot, He <u>will not</u> save the world without us. So it was that during His short life on earth, Jesus gathered around Him a little band who would form the nucleus of the Church. To the outsider it would have seemed total madness – Jesus did not exactly choose influential people to continue His work. Even Jesus' miracles and teaching were not enough to convert them. Seeing is obviously not necessarily believing.

It was the direct action of God which changed these first disciples – Pentecost for the Apostles, and the appearance of the Risen Lord to Paul on his way to Damascus. Saint Paul would emphasise over and over again – it is all God's initiative. He has a plan both for the world at large and for

each of us individually. This was the theme of Pope Benedict's message a few years ago.



The Holy Father wrote: "The vocation to the priesthood and to the consecrated life constitutes a special gift of God which becomes part of the great plan of love and salvation that God has for every man and woman and for the whole of humanity. Saint Paul says: 'Blessed be God.. he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him' (Eph 1:-4)."

To achieve this God chose some to follow His Son more closely. "The divine Master personally called the Apostles. They, in turn, gathered other disciples around them as faithful collaborators in this mission. Over the centuries countless ranks of priests and consecrated persons placed themselves totally at the service of the Gospel in the Church. Even today He continues to call together workers into His vineyard, persons of every culture and of every age and invites them to follow Him according to the mysterious plans of His merciful love."

The entire Christian people must grow in trust in God, continued Pope Benedict, convinced that the Lord of the harvest does not cease to ask some to place their entire existence freely at His service. God still calls – we must pray that those He is calling will listen carefully with prudent discernment. God's free initiative must be met with free response. No one, of course, is worthy. And no one can respond purely on the human level. Look at the Apostles! Without the Holy Spirit they were completely ineffective.

That same Spirit is still at work turning the timid into the strong. Men and women can still do this, remembering the words of Jesus, "Pray the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest" (Matt 9:38). It is one of the few things Jesus asked us specifically to pray for, and we must take His request seriously, praying for vocations not just today but continuously, and encouraging those in our care to think about a vocation. Like Our Lady, said the Pope, we must cultivate the ability to be astonished by God.

Pray for your priests, pray for vocations.
