## FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT - YEAR C

23 DECEMBER 2018

**READINGS:** Micah 5:1-4; Hebrews 10:5-10; Luke 1:39-44

When the prophet Micah was writing, Jerusalem was under siege and David's dynasty was in jeopardy. The prophet announces that salvation would come from the most insignificant place — Bethlehem (**FIRST READING**). The **GOSPEL** relates Mary's visit to her cousin Elizabeth. Enlightened by the Holy Spirit, Elizabeth praises Mary's faith and hints at the uniqueness of the child she has conceived.

The author of the Book of Hebrews states that Jesus did not come to offer the sacrifices of the Old Law but to do the will of God (**SECOND READING**).

My dear people,

For three weeks we have been expecting. Expecting what, exactly? Pope Benedict has some thoughts, well worth our meditation. "Expectation" he says, is profoundly human. "Expectation and waiting represent a dimension that touches our entire individual, family and social existence. Expectation is present in many situations, from the smallest and most insignificant to the most important - a couple expecting a child; awaiting a relative or friend who comes to visit us from far away; the expectation of the result of some decisive examination; in personal relations the expectation of meeting a loved one. We could say that man is alive as long as he expects, so long as hope remains alive in his heart. And man can be recognised by his expectations - our moral and spiritual stature may be measured by what our hopes are.

"So, in this time of preparation for Christmas, each of us may ask ourselves: What do I expect? And this same question can be posed at the level of the family, the community, the nation. What do we expect together? What unites our aspirations, what brings us together? In Israel in the period prior to Jesus' birth, there was a very strong expectation of the Messiah, who would free the people from all moral and political slavery and establish the Kingdom of God.

"But no-one could have imagined that the Messiah would be born of a humble girl like Mary, who had been promised in marriage to the good Joseph. Neither could she have imagined it; yet in her heart the expectation of the Saviour was so great, her faith and hope so ardent, that in her He could find a worthy mother. There is a mysterious correspondence between the expectation of God and that of Mary, the creature 'full of grace', completely transparent before the Almighty's plan of love. Let us learn from her, the woman of Advent, to live daily life with a new spirit, with feelings of profound expectation which only the coming of God can satisfy."



So, we could ask: What is God expecting this Christmas? Because everything we do is a response to His initiative. St John of the Cross, who was Teresa of Avila's helper in the Carmelite reform, and whose Feast we celebrate this month, could be our guide. Our God is a God who is always giving. Look at the Trinity - three persons eternally giving themselves to each other in love, so much so they are one God. And God's desire in creating us is to give Himself to us in love. He is an approaching God, always desiring union. John of the Cross makes an extraordinary statement in his writings, well worth pondering: "I can see that Christ is very little known by those who think themselves His friends". Christ wishes to fill us with Himself - but few of us create the space into which He can enter. We fill the space in our hearts with other things, many of which cannot provide the happiness we really long for.

The space we make in our hearts can perhaps be measured by the space we make each day for prayer. The goal of prayer is union with God. As Catholics, we have many forms of prayer. But, above all, we have the Mass and the presence of Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. Our greatest gift to Our Lord for His Birthday would be the promise to pursue union with Him more deeply in the coming year about to start - a time set aside each day for Him; an extra Mass; taking advantage of the times the Blessed Sacrament is exposed for adoration. We are about to celebrate His Birth - not a past event, but His desire to be born again in us. The words of the Dominican Meister Eckhart (+1329), will always ring true: "*What good is it to me if this eternal birth of the divine Son takes place unceasingly, but does not take place within myself?*".
