## FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER — YEAR C 12 MAY 2019

**READINGS:** Acts 13:14,43-52; Apoc 7:9, 14-17; Jn 10:27-30  
Paul and Barnabas preach the Gospel firstly to the Jews but they reject it. They then turn to the Gentiles who receive it with joy. Thus Isaiah's prophecy is fulfilled that God's message would reach the ends of the earth (**FIRST READING**). We, too, may meet with mixed reactions when we use our gifts in the service of God. St John sees in vision those who will come through times of persecution to share in Christ's glory in heaven (**SECOND READING**).

Jesus, the Good Shepherd, will not allow anyone to snatch from His care the sheep the Father has given Him (**GOSPEL**).

## A VOCATION VIEW

My Dear People,

This is Vocation Sunday, established by Pope St Paul VI after the Second Vatican Council. He chose this particular Sunday each year because of the Gospel of the Good Shepherd read on this day. He urged, as has every Pope since, the whole Church to pray, not only on this day but every day. Pray for what?

It may be misleading to say that we should pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. A vocation is a call — from God. To pray for ‘vocations’ may seem to suggest that God is not calling, and therefore we should ask Him to do better! No, the Church is Christ’s Church. He died to establish it. He instituted the Mass and the Sacraments to nourish it. The Church — us — is never absent from His mind and heart. Therefore, He must always be calling men and women to serve it! For some reason, or many reasons, His call is not being heard. Therefore, we have a role to play. The responsibility of preparing the ground for vocations belongs to the whole Church, said the Council.

- \* Firstly, we should all pray daily that many more will hear Christ’s call to be priests and religious.
- \* We should consider that God might wish to use each one of us as an instrument to bring God’s call to a potential priest or religious. We may know someone we think could have a vocation. That person may just need a little encouragement.
- \* Parents should speak about vocations to their children who are discerning their future in life — this goes for teachers in our schools, too. Always speak about religious vocations in the most positive terms in front of children.

When I was at the Eucharistic Congress in Lourdes in 1981, I heard the African Cardinal Gantin



representing Pope John Paul (he was still in hospital following the assassination attempt) say during the final Mass, which was an Ordination Mass: “The Church will get the vocations it deserves!”. You can take that several ways. But God can hardly answer prayers that are not forthcoming.

In his message for today, Pope Francis says: “Dear friends, it is not always easy to discern our vocation and to steer our life in the right direction. For this reason, there needs to be a renewed commitment on the part of the whole Church — priests, religious, pastoral workers and educators — to provide young people in particular with opportunities for listening and discernment. There is need for a youth ministry and a vocational promotion that can open the way to discovering God’s plan, above all through prayer, meditation, Eucharistic Adoration and spiritual accompaniment.”

Young people need a religious environment in which to grow. Happily, a Youth Group has been established in the parish. St Therese at West Wollongong also has a Group, and there is talk of perhaps the two joining forces.

Eucharistic Adoration, with focus on 18-30 year-olds, has been established in two centres in the Diocese: St Francis Xavier Cathedral in Wollongong and Our Lady Help of Christians Church in Rosemeadow. Adoration is from 6.30pm to 7.30pm, followed by a shared meal. The next evenings at the Cathedral are Wednesday nights, 10 July, 14 August and 9 October.

In the words of Mother Teresa of Calcutta, Adoration is “the best time you will spend on earth”.

We have currently two students at Good Shepherd Seminary at Homebush: James Arblaster and Sinh Le. Pray for them.
