Message from Fr Duane

It has been wonderful to be able to see some parishioners again as we gradually re-open our churches. We began with a maximum of 10, and as of 4 June the Diocese has allowed for a capacity of 50 worshippers at Mass. We need to remain vigilant with our precautions at this time. This is the reason for the strict Government regulations, which the Diocese, and in turn our parishes, are complying with as best we possibly can. We want people to not only be kept safe but also to feel safe as they return to worship together.

Those classified by the Government as more "vulnerable" to Coronavirus than others include those with compromised immune systems, those over 65 with chronic health conditions, and those over 70. As per Government and Diocesan regulations, we have encouraged you not to come physically to Mass, but rather to continue to watch our live stream Mass at 5pm, to ensure your own health and safety. However, if you are aware of the risks to your health and do decide you wish to attend Mass physically, please be assured that you will be warmly welcomed (and you will not be asked your age!)

NB: The Registration system is attached separately in the email correspondence. Once you register your preferences, please wait until you receive a confirmation email. You will receive confirmation of weekday Masses as soon as possible, which will remain from week to week unless we inform you otherwise. However, confirmation of Sunday Masses will only be possible approximately 24 hours prior to each Sunday Mass. This is to ensure fairest possible access to Sunday Masses during the coming weeks, given the limited capacity at present.

Thank you to Sue Briscoe and Magda Pires, the Parish secretaries at Unanderra Parish office, for taking on the mammoth task of registering parishioners at both Immaculate Conception and St Therese Parishes. From creating the registration process, to the large increase in emails and phone calls, they have worked tirelessly to enable our parishioners to come back to Mass, in the fairest possible way.

Thank you to all who have volunteered to serve as "monitors" for our Parishes. In our very first week of calling for help we have about 25 volunteers to serve in this way, which is wonderful to see! Many of these monitors have worked many hours throughout the week, planning together and physically preparing our churches to ensure that all who come will be safe, and feel safe, as you return to church.

Thank you to St Therese Primary School and St Pius Primary School for their generous practical support, in sharing hand sanitiser and other provisions with our parishes. There is a wonderful spirit of co-operation between our parishes and schools in this place.

Finally, thank you for your continued engagement with our Parishes, either through our live streamed Masses or registering to attend our churches again. I do look forward to the opportunity of seeing you all again in the near future, and giving you Communion!

SUNDAY 7 JUNE 2020 — MOST HOLY TRINITY SUNDAY (YEAR A)
