## Message from Fr Duane

I once again wish to express my deep gratitude to all of you for your patience and co-operation with the regulations currently in place for Mass attendance. Special thanks to our wonderful “monitors” who continue to give so cheerfully and generously of their time to make it possible for us all to worship together, and to Sue and Magda at Unanderra Parish office for the extra work involved in registration for Masses.

At this time of year, the Church throughout the world celebrates two very special feasts: the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on Friday 19 June, and the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary on Saturday 20 June - which is the patronal Feast of the Diocese of Wollongong, marked during our Sunday Masses this weekend. The closeness of these two feasts reminds us of the inseparable closeness of the hearts of Jesus and Mary. The Sacred Heart of Jesus is one of the most well known devotional images in the Church – a heart wounded for our sins, and on fire with Divine Love. We are keenly aware of the suffering in our world during these times and can take great comfort from remembering that in the suffering heart of Jesus we see a compassionate God who suffers with us and for us. So too, the “sword of sorrow” pierced the heart of Mary, his mother at the foot of the cross of her Son, and the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary draws our attention to the inner life of Mary who “pondered in her heart” the mysteries of God, and said a perfect yes of faith in all the joys and sorrows of her life. May these two feasts bring abundant blessings upon our Parishes, our Diocese, and our world during these difficult times.

## SUNDAY 21 JUNE 2020 — 12th SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME (YEAR A)

**First Reading** — Jeremiah 20:10-13 — *He has delivered the soul of the needy from the hands of those who are evil.* Jeremiah said: 'I hear so many disparaging me, "Terror from every side! Denounce him! Let us denounce him!". All those who used to be my friends watched for my downfall, "Perhaps he will be seduced into error. Then we will master him and take our revenge!". But the Lord is at my side, a mighty hero; my opponents will stumble, mastered, confounded by their failure; everlasting, unforgettable disgrace will be theirs. But you, Lord of Hosts, you who probe with justice, who scrutinise the loins and heart, let me see the vengeance you will take on them, for I have committed my cause to you. Sing to the Lord, praise the Lord, for he has delivered the soul of the needy from the hands of evil men.'



**Responsorial Psalm** — *Lord, in your great love, answer me.*

1. It is for you that I suffer taunts, that shame covers my face,  
that I have become a stranger to my brothers, an alien to my own mother's sons.  
I burn with zeal for your house and taunts against you fall on me. R.
2. This is my prayer to you, my prayer for your favour.  
In your great love, answer me, O God, with your help that never fails:  
Lord, answer, for your love is kind; in your compassion, turn towards me. R.
3. The poor when they see it will be glad and God-seeking hearts will revive;  
for the Lord listens to the needy and does not spurn his servants in their chains.  
Let the heavens and the earth give him praise, the sea and all its living creatures. R.

**Second Reading** — Romans 5:12-15 — *God's gift to us is nothing like our sin against him.*

Sin entered the world through one man, and through sin death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned. Sin existed in the world long before the Law was given. There was no law and so no one could be accused of the sin of 'law-breaking', yet death reigned over all from Adam to Moses, even though their sin, unlike that of Adam, was not a matter of breaking a law.

Adam prefigured the One to come, but the gift itself considerably outweighed the fall. If it is certain that through one man's fall so many died, it is even more certain that divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift.

**Gospel Acclamation**

Alleluia, alleluia! I The Spirit of Truth will bear witness to me, says the Lord, and you also will be my witnesses. Alleluia!

**Gospel** — Matthew 10:26-33 — *Do not fear those who can kill the body.*

Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows: 'Do not be afraid. For everything that is now covered will be uncovered, and everything now hidden will be made clear. What I say to you in the dark, tell in the daylight; what you hear in whispers, proclaim from the house-tops. Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; fear him rather who can destroy both body and soul in hell. Can you not buy two sparrows for a penny? And yet not one falls to the ground without your Father knowing. Why, every hair on your head has been counted. So there is no need to be afraid; you are worth more than hundreds of sparrows. So if anyone declares himself for me in the presence of men, I will declare myself for him in the presence of my Father in heaven. But the one who disowns me in the presence of men, I will disown in the presence of my Father in heaven.'
