Message from Fr Duane

The Diocese has provided new Directives for parishes as of 1 July 2020, to guide us in implementing the new State legislation which became effective on that day. The most important change that now applies is the shift from a maximum of 50 worshippers to the maximum allowed according to the "4 square metre rule", which makes the maximum number of worshippers for both Unanderra and West Wollongong now exactly 76 people (an unexpected coincidence!)

Registration processes remain the same as they have been for Sunday Masses at both Unanderra and West Wollongong. A brief reminder of that process: once you have registered your preferences for Mass at either parish (by emailing unanderra@dow.org.au only, or calling Unanderra Parish Office during their office hours, found on the front page of the bulletin) you are entered into the database permanently — there is no need to re-register each week, as we presume your preferences will remain the same from week to week unless you inform us otherwise. Please wait for confirmation from me approximately 24 hours prior to a given Sunday Mass indicating that it is possible for you to attend your preferred Sunday Mass. If you haven't heard from me 24 hours prior to your preferred Mass, feel free to text me on 0414 626 357.

Regarding weekday Masses: if you haven't registered, we do ask that you still email **unanderra@dow.org.au** to register (or call 4271 1068 during office hours), as this will make it easier for the monitor at the door. However at this stage, on the spot registration will be possible for all weekday Masses (including Saturday morning), given the increased capacity permitted.

We would like to begin Eucharistic Adoration again in both parishes, but this would require more volunteers as monitors to make it sustainable. Anyone in the lowest risk group (under 65 and healthy) who would like to volunteer as monitors at either church, possibly only for the Eucharistic Adoration times – at 4.30pm Tuesday (U), Wednesday (WW) and Thursday (U) – please contact me.

Baptisms are happening again, only through personal arrangement with me. Dates are more flexible than usual, given the backlog of cancelled baptisms throughout the year. The maximum number of attendees is 76 for baptisms as well, and it will be the responsibility of the family to provide a list of names and contact phone numbers of all who are attending before the ceremony.

Reconciliation is available by appointment with me, at any time that proves suitable throughout the week – preferably away from Mass times so as to avoid complications when it comes to monitoring, cleaning, etc for Masses. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him, and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you.
