Message from Fr Duane

During recent weeks we have prayed together with Catholics throughout the world for the repose of the soul of Pope Benedict XVI. This week, we pray for the repose of the soul of Cardinal George Pell. Pope Francis shared these words of condolence and prayer, addressed no doubt in a special way to the Church in Australia:

"I offer sentiments of heartfelt condolence, remembering with a grateful heart his consistent and committed witness, his dedication to the Gospel and the Church, and particularly his diligent cooperation with the Holy See in the context of its recent economic reform, of which he laid the foundations with determination and wisdom. I raise prayers for the repose of this faithful servant, who unwaveringly followed his Lord with perseverance even in the hour of trial, that he may be received into the joy of heaven and receive the reward of eternal peace."

It is worth reflecting on words of Cardinal George Pell himself about what comes after death, put in his characteristic down-to-earth language, when he said "I have never had a problem with the doctrine that purification might be needed before we can be in God's presence or cope with his goodness. I have compared it to the discomfort we experience when woken by a sudden bright light." These words from the Cardinal brought to my mind the words of the Second Eucharistic Prayer as we pray for the dead: "welcome them into the light of your face". Eternal rest grant unto him, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace. Amen.




