Message from Fr Duane

Congratulations to the young people who received the Sacrament of Confirmation in our parishes this past week. It was wonderful to see the way that they and their families entered into the preparation and celebration of this beautiful Sacrament. Thank you also to the Sacramental Team for their wonderful work throughout the preparation and celebration of these ceremonies, and to Bishop Brian for his generosity in celebrating 4 ceremonies across our two parishes and connecting so well with the children and their families. Some of these children and families are regularly attending Sunday Mass with us already, which is wonderful to see, as the graces they received in Confirmation will continue to be nourished by the Eucharist and the support of the faith community. Let's also pray that the Holy Spirit will guide all the newly Confirmed children and their families into a closer relationship with Christ and his Church in the years ahead, especially through our continued efforts of making our parish a place of welcome and belonging for all.

We celebrate this weekend the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (traditionally called the Feast of "Corpus Christi"). This is an opportunity to reflect on the wonderful mystery that is at the heart of our Mass and indeed of our Catholic faith – the mystery of Christ truly present in the Eucharist uniting us in the most wonderful way possible with God and one another. First Reading - Deuteronomy 8:2-3,14-16 He gave you food which you and your ancestors did not know. Moses said to the people: 'Remember how the Lord your God led you for forty years in the wilderness, to humble you, to test you and know your inmost heart – whether you would keep his commandments or not. He humbled you, he made you feel hunger, he fed you with manna which neither you nor your fathers had known, to make you understand that man does not live on bread alone but that man lives on everything that comes from the mouth of the Lord. 'Do not become proud of heart. Do not forget the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery: who guided you through this vast and dreadful wilderness, a land of fiery serpents, scorpions, thirst; who in this waterless place brought you water from the hardest rock; who in this wilderness fed you with manna that your fathers had not known.' **Responsorial Psalm - Praise the Lord Jerusalem!** 1 O praise the Lord, Jerusalem! Zion, praise your God! He has strengthened the bars of your gates, he has blessed the children within you. R. He established peace on your borders, he feeds you with finest wheat. 2. He sends out his word to the earth and swiftly runs his command. R. 3. He makes his word known to Jacob, to Israel his laws and decrees.

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 10:16-17 Though we are many, we form a single body because we share this one loaf.

The blessing-cup that we bless is a communion with the blood of Christ, and the bread that we break is a communion with the body of Christ. The fact that there is only one loaf means that, though there are many of us, we form a single body because we all have a share in this one loaf.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia! I am the living bread from heaven says the Lord; whoever eats this bread will live forever. Alleluia!

Gospel - John 6:51-58 My flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. Jesus said to the crowd: 'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.' Then the Jews started arguing with one another: 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' they said. Jesus replied: 'I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in you. Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him. As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me. This is the bread come down from heaven: not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.'
