Message from Sr Kerry

Peter was to celebrate Mass at Baxter Detention Centre and he asked me if I would like to accompany him. The paperwork involved prior to our arrival was very bureaucratic. That was nothing to what I was to experience. We were to go through seven

electronic gates, always accompanied by guards. No two gates could be opened at the same time. In one section our hand was stamped with an infra-red stamp. At one point we needed to have our hand examined by an infra-red light and a security guard.

Peter had also organised that we share time with some of the detainees after Mass. We were locked in a yard surrounded by colour bond fencing. You couldn't see out or in; you could only see up and the sky was all that graced our eyes. That image has haunted me. Locked in and blinded and constrained by colour bond fencing.

Is your heart surrounded by colour bond fencing that keeps others out and only gives you a very limited vision?

#### SOCIAL JUSTICE POINTS

Today's globalized world has brought all of us closer together, yet it has not made us any more fraternal. Indeed, we are suffering from a famine of fraternity, which arises from the many situations of injustice, poverty and inequality and also from the lack of a culture of solidarity. "New ideologies, characterized by widespread individualism, egocentrism and materialistic consumerism, weaken social bonds, fuelling that 'throwaway' mentality, which leads to contempt for and abandonment of, the weakest and those considered 'useless'. In this way human coexistence increasingly tends to resemble a mere do ut des which is both pragmatic and selfish". Yet the worst effect of this famine of fraternity is armed conflict and war, that makes enemies of not only individuals but entire peoples, and whose negative consequences reverberate for generations. With the founding of the United Nations, it seemed that the world had learned, after two terrible world wars, to move towards a more stable peace, to become, at last, a family of nations. First Reading - Jeremiah 20:10-13 He has delivered the soul of the needy from the hands of those who are evil. Jeremiah said:

I hear so many disparaging me, "Terror from every side!"

Denounce him! Let us denounce him!'

All those who used to be my friends watched for my downfall,

'Perhaps he will be seduced into error.

Then we will master him and take our revenge!'

#### Second Reading - Romans 5:12-15 God's gift to us is nothing like our sin against him.

Sin entered the world through one man, and through sin death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned. Sin existed in the world long before the Law was given. There was no law and so no one could be accused of the sin of 'law-breaking', yet death reigned over all from Adam to Moses, even though their sin, unlike that of Adam, was not a matter of breaking a law.

Adam prefigured the One to come, but the gift itself considerably outweighed the fall. If it is certain that through one man's fall so many died, it is even more certain that divine grace, coming through the one man, Jesus Christ, came to so many as an abundant free gift.

#### Gospel - Matthew 10:26-33 Do not fear those who can kill the body.

Jesus instructed the Twelve as follows: 'Do not be afraid. For everything that is now covered will be uncovered, and everything now hidden will be made clear. What I say to you in the dark, tell in the daylight; what you hear in whispers, proclaim from the

'Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; fear him rather who can destroy both body and soul in hell. Can you not buy two sparrows for a penny? And yet not one falls to the ground without your Father knowing. Why, every hair on your head has been counted. So there is no need to be afraid; you are worth more than hundreds of sparrows.

'So if anyone declares himself for me in the presence of men, I will declare myself for him in the presence of my Father in heaven. But the one who disowns me in the presence of men, I will disown in the presence of my Father in heaven.'
