Our next joint parish social event will be the "Community Fun Day", locked in now for Sunday August 6th at 11:30am at Edmund Rice College. Thank you to Judith Hurley and Edmund Rice for so generously hosting us once again, and to the Community Co-ordination Teams in our two parishes for organizing this event. Last year's Community Fun Day saw over 200 people of all ages come along in spite of uncertain weather, and enjoy food and fun, with new connections made and deepening of existing bonds.

As well as these purely social events, we also look forward to our second instalment of Alpha. The first Alpha was a wonderful success, with many new friendships formed, and many experiencing new and deepening experiences of God's love, and as a result seeking deeper connection with the parish community. The next Alpha starts on Wednesday August 30th.

Your interests are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the Spirit of God has made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him, and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you.

So then, my brothers, there is no necessity for us to obey our unspiritual selves or to live unspiritual lives. If you do live in that way, you are doomed to die; but if by the Spirit you put an end to the misdeeds of the body you will live.
